REPORT FOR THE YEARS 1965 & 1966

GENTLEMEN,

The season of 1965 was somewhat of an anti-climax after the thrills and excitements of Olympic Year. Nevertheless it opened with a closely contested 'Varsity Sports' on 8th May at The White City, with Wendell Mottley (Cambridge) being awarded The Drake Digby Trophy for the best performance. Oxford won by 79 points to Cambridge's 74 points.

In 1966 Oxford again won the Sports by 87 to 66 points, with Wendell Mottley once more being awarded The Drake Digby Trophy.

The Annual General Meeting, Club Cocktail Party, Blues and Members Dinner and the Achilles Ball were transferred to Hurlingham Club, and proved to be a great success during both years. It is hoped that more and more Old Blues will attend, and they can rest assured that on future occasions the volume of the bands, normal and 'pear' will be modulated to more reasonable levels. The presence of Old Blues is vital to ensure the success of this annual re-union.

The Honorary Treasurer reports as follows:—

In 1965 subscription income was a little over £400 with an additional £100 in entry fees and special contributions from Old Blues. This figure was two and a half times the average income before the changed subscription arrangement in 1963/64. Nevertheless the Club spent approximately £250 more than its income—largely accounted for by the cost of the large 1964 Annual Report and the Treasurer feels that the Club's printing bills must now be pegged before they swallow a disproportionate part of the new income. However the main objective of asking the Old Blues to contribute to present day costs was to finance an increased level of match expenses and team management effort—and the Treasurer feels that those who responded (rather less than half the total membership) can share some of the acknowledgements for the Clubs return to successful competition in the last two seasons.

So far in 1966 (October) our expenditure is roughly level with normal income, which is an improvement on recent years. The total subscription figure should be about £550 for the year and future years may reach about £600 before levelling off. Book Royalties have dropped now to an almost negligible figure, and the best hope for further income, which is certainly needed to finance worthwhile tours abroad, is from tax recovery on monies paid to the Achilles Trust which is now in being, thanks to the direction of the Club's Chairman of Committee and the particular efforts of the Hon. Competition Secretary.

IN MEMORIAM

The Committee regret to report the

In 1965 the Club won the Sward Trophy and had it not been for mechanical calamities on the M.A. might also have won the Kinnaird Trophy. In 1966 the Club however reclaimed the Kinnaird. The Honorary Competition Secretary and Team Manager's Report is set out below.

"Both 1965 and 1966 were reasonably successful years for the Club in open competition. In 1965 the Club won the Sward Trophy and only missed winning the Kinnaird by a narrow margin through a chapter of accidents. However in 1966, inspired by David Hall the Club had an overwhelming victory in the Kinnaird but a somewhat unsuccessful defence of the Sward Trophy. In neither of these two years have our short distance relays been successful, seemingly because the competition was either too soon in the season or clashed with internationals, holidays etc.

In matches not confined to the first claim rule the fixture list expands steadily. In both 1965 and 1966 the Milocarians were defeated and many successful school matches were held. Our schools fixture list comprises Eton, Eastbourne, Stowe, Marlborough, Winchester and Cheltenham amongst our regular hosts and it is hoped to widen the scope in 1967 with a short schools tour in the South in June or July and one in the North earlier in the season. Undoubtedly the policy of individual match managers has paid off and our thanks are due to Peter Banner, Cecil Parkinson, John Kitching, Donald Gorrie, David Donaldson, John Boulter, Bobby Angier, Richard Blaxill, Mike Ralph, Arthur Calvert-Smith and others for their noble work.

1965 was the American Tour Year but in 1966 the Club was invited once again to Guernsey for what was undoubtedly a most enjoyable weekend from all points of view. Further in 1966 new ground was broken by a match against West Cornwall which it is hoped to continue. In 1966 Roger Robinson kindly undertook to look after our long distance relay team and managed to obtain a place in the L.A.C. 4 x 1 mile relay. For some time now our longer distance strength on the track has not been as strong as we should wish, and it is hoped that this further competition will remedy this deficit and encourage long distance runners to remain first claim for the track season.

Towards the end of 1965 it became obvious to the then Honorary Team Manager that his duties were becoming as much secretarial as managerial, and that the time had come for more help at the centre of the team management. This was achieved by the appointment of David Hall as Honorary Team Manager and by a division of function appointing Robert Stinson to a new office of Honorary Competition Secretary to concentrate on elections, fixtures and foreign tours, it being hoped that the Club may make another visit to Scandinavia in 1967.

The joint Oxford and Cambridge team left by air for the United States on 13th June 1965, under the sponsorship of *The Daily Mail* and *Associated Newspapers* for the U.S. Series of 1965-1967. E. H. Freitag was in charge of the party of 16 athletes, and with Alan Malcolm as coach.

Matches were held against Cornell and Pennsylvania in Ithaca on Friday 18th June 1965, and against Harvard and Yale in Cambridge Mass. on Tuesday 22nd June. These were followed by members of the team taking part in the Canadian Championships at Montreal on 25th/26th June, and a match against a re-inforced Hamilton Olympic Club on Tuesday 29th June 1965. The tour resulted in a draw of 8 events each against Cornell and Pennsylvania, and a defeat by Harvard and Yale by 11 events to 5. Four titles were won in the Canadian Championships, and a weakened University team narrowly lost to Hamilton Olympic Club by 5 events to 8. The tour was thoroughly enjoyed by all who took part in it, and old friendships were renewed at the U.S. Universities and in Canada.

In 1966 Oxford and Cambridge acted as Hosts to the Cornell and Pennsylvania team. On arrival in London they stayed the night in the London area in the homes of Club members whose help was much appreciated. After a few days at Stowe School, followed by a match against Atlanta in Glasgow and some days in Cambridge, the match took place on Wednesday 22nd June in the evening at the Crystal Palace. Thus resulted in a draw with each team winning 8 events. For the first time International Invitation Events were staged —*The Evening News* Junior Mile, Pole Vault, 5000 metres and 4 x 880 yds. relay. The 5000 metre race resulted in a surprise victory for K. Sawawki of Japan over Ron Clarke (Australia), and Great Britain's team in the 4 x 880 yds. relay, including John Boulter, Peter T. J. Banner, D. W. Donaldson, A. P. Metcalfe and H. R. Stinson and others, put in a great deal of work to ensure the British World Record. We all owe a great debt to our sponsors *The Daily Mail*, *Evening News* and *Associated Newspapers Ltd.*, and in particular to Terry O'Connor, who did so much to make a success of this meeting and the dinner. Many of our members including P. T. J. Banner, D. W. Donaldson, A. P. Metcalfe and H. R. Stinson and others, put in a great deal of work to ensure the successful organisation of a meeting of this calibre. An exhilarated crowd responded to the specially prepared presentation of the Meeting.

In August 1965 five athletes from Oxford and Cambridge competed in the World University Games in Budapest—J. Archer, T. Boulter and D. A. Roscoe from Oxford; J. Cook and T. F. K. Johnston from Cambridge.

The British Empire and Commonwealth Games were held in Kingston Jamaica in August 1966, where four members of the Club took part. Wendell Mortley, representing Trinidad and Tobago, won the 440 yards and was a member of the World Record breaking 4 x 440 yards relay team. R. Oldcorn was a member of England's winning sabre team in Fencing and J. M. Parker (England) won the silver medal for 120 yards hurdles. J. P. Boulter also competed for England. In addition several other Club members were present—Sir Arthur Porritt and K. S. Duncan (Chairman and Honorary Secretary B.E. & C.G. Federation), H. M. Abrahams (B.A.A.B.), Ross McWhirter, Vernon Morgan (Reuters) and Rex Alston.

Meanwhile the Achilles School Relays grow in strength, under the able management of David Donaldson and Donald Gorrie. Cousin's opinion had been sought on the formation of a Trust to cover as many of the Club's activities as possible in the Undergraduates sphere. The Trust has now been formed with the President

and two Vice-Presidents as Trustees, and a Committee of Management consisting of the Club's Executive Officers, the approval of the Department of Education & Science and the Inland Revenue having been obtained.

Consideration was given to holding a Club Dinner every fourth year in the year before the Olympic Games, alternatively at Oxford and Cambridge, and the next Dinner is planned for Saturday 30th September 1967, at St. John's College, Cambridge.

The Clubs Trophies were removed from the bank which had housed them safely throughout the last war, and after cleaning and re-engraving it was found possible to allocate new trophies as under: A trophy for the best performance by a member of the Club in the Kinnaird and also in the Sward Trophy competitions; Challenge Cups for the Field Events and the Freshmen's matches; and five trophies for the Achilles School Relays.

The full Report of 1964, along with names and addresses, seems to have been appreciated by many members, and the sum of about £80 was received towards the printing costs. Our thanks are given to all those members who contributed.

Despite change of address cards previously sent out to all members we are still having correspondence returned marked 'Gone Away'. A list of names is to be found elsewhere in the Report, and any up-to-date addresses will be welcomed.

Finally the thanks of the Club are given to the Officers, members, of the Committee, all those concerned with Team Management, and other members who have done so much to help the Club throughout the two years.
